

Right-of-Way Reminders

What you need to know now after you have a permit to work in the right-of-way!

Hours of Operation

when right-of-way permit holders can work

*Are your activities in the street or
Are you shifting a lane of traffic?*

- Follow the MUTCD for temporary traffic control
- Set up traffic control at 8:30 am
- All activities should be completed and off of the road before 4:30 pm



Are you parking in the street?

- Under 4 hours, does not require a permit. Please be respectful of traffic and neighbors.
- Over 4 hours, come to Public Works and get a permit for your activities.

Working hours on designated residential streets start at 7:00 am and must be completed by 10:00 pm per our noise ordinance.

While you are working

being respectful of your work space / our neighborhoods

- FILL YOUR HOLE FRIDAY!
- Sweep the roadway as necessary.
- Don't leave open holes unattended and cone your work area if necessary.
- Don't litter. Please be prepared to take your personal and work related debris with you at the end of each work day.
- Communicate with residents when working on their property (lawn flyer or personal communication).

Call Public Works at 913-385-4647 to schedule an inspection when you are ready to pour concrete or making repairs to the pavement.

Restoration

after your work is completed and before you leave the area

Grass or Lawn:

Sod is required for restoration. (CP225)
Very small areas may use seed.
City approval required prior to installation.

Show the inspector the ticket for KCMMB concrete.



Concrete:

KCMMB 4K concrete
Sidewalk is 4"
Residential drives are 6"
Commercial drives are 8"

Pavement:

The pavement is our most valuable and heavily used asset. Call Public Works for an inspection involving pavement repairs at all stages.

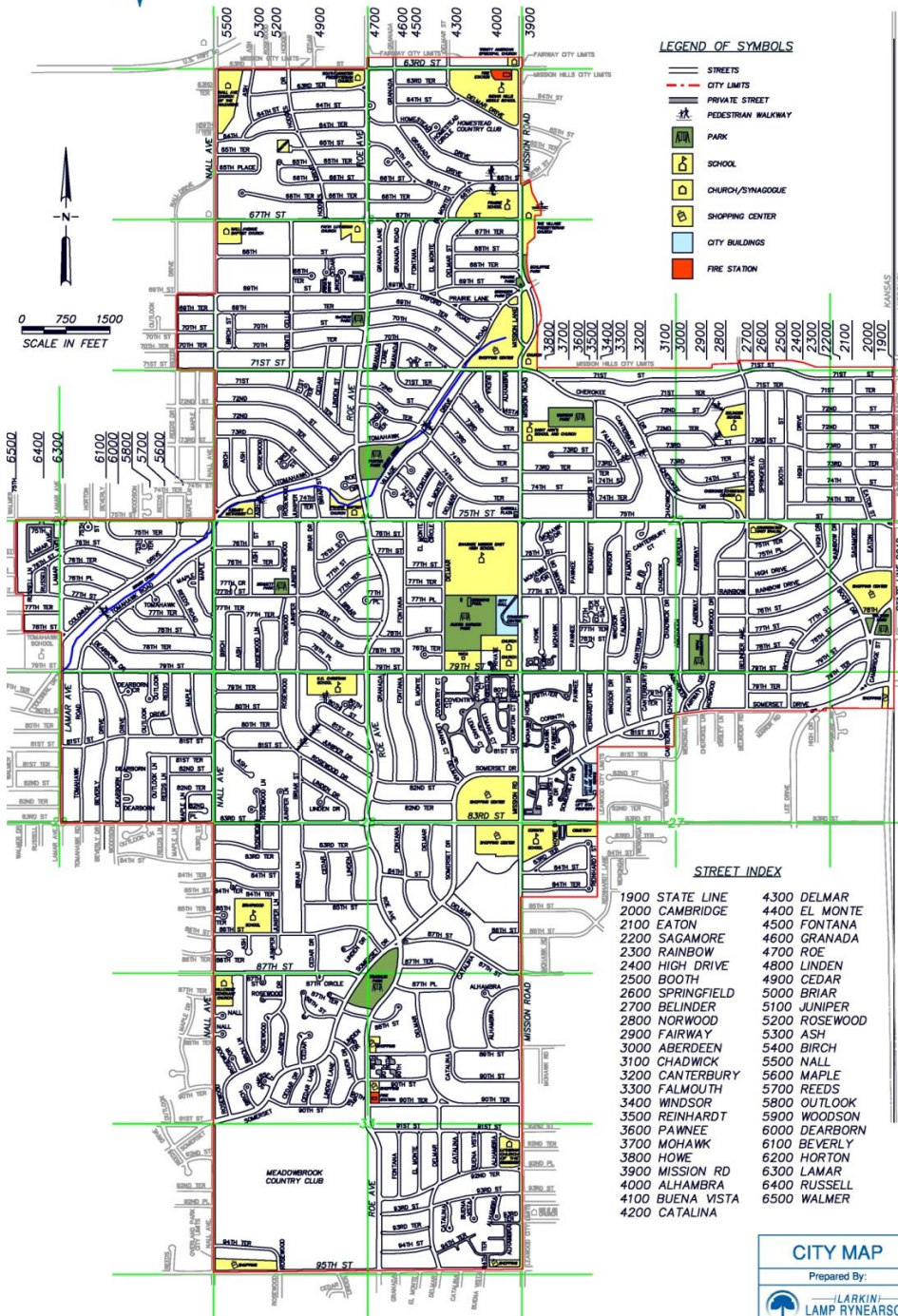
Detail 205.01:

- Flowable Fill
- Concrete to "minus 2 inches"
- APWA Type 3 for surface or OP-ILC mix for surface

All crews should have a set of the Prairie Village Standard Details. These details include important information regarding construction of driveways, sidewalks, pavement, etc. The information in this pamphlet is to make you aware of your responsibilities as a permittee and does not replace the requirements of the standard details, the Council Policies or Chapter 13. Article 5: Use and Occupancy of the Public Right-of-Way.

Right-of-Way Permits

Do I need a permit?

Yes, if you are working in the right-of-way. An approved permit is needed prior to beginning any work in the right-of-way in the City of Prairie Village.

Where can I get a permit?

How much does a permit cost?

\$70 (cash, check and credit cards are accepted)

Do I (Contractor) need a bond?

Yes. Permits require a performance and maintenance bond in the amount of \$5000, or the value of the work, whichever is greater. The bond is in effect for 2 years. Contractors working on a regular basis may consider a \$50,000 annual renewable bond. (Ch. 13-517 PV CODE)

Do I (Homeowner) need a bond?

No. If you are performing the work yourself, as the homeowner and not utilizing a contractor, you may get a permit without the bond requirement. However, if you have hired a contractor it is recommended for the contractor to get the permit in order to provide the maintenance bond (warranty) for the work performed.
