## Police Citizens Academy Announcement

Applications are now being accepted for the **Prairie Village Police Citizens Academy**, to begin in mid December. The Academy is a ten-week course and meets once each week in the evenings. The Prairie Village Citizens' Police Academy is a community-involved program designed to provide citizens with firsthand knowledge of the day-to-day operations of a modern police department. The goal of the academy is to improve the relationship between the community and its police officers by "personalizing" the Department. The Academy achieves this goal through lectures, visual aids and hands-on fieldwork to give attendees insight into the functions of the Prairie Village Police Department.

The Academy takes a **hands-on approach to learning**, and classes offer a unique opportunity to involve participants in discussing the Department's methods of operation, philosophies and goals. Some of the topics include: Traffic Enforcement, Officer Safety Tactics, Shoot/Don't Shoot, Kansas Law, United States Law, Crime Scene Processing, Communications and Processing Records.

You must be able to meet the following established criteria to be considered a candidate for the Academy:

- Must be able to commit both time and energy
- Must possess a concern for law enforcement service in our community
- Must be at least 16 years of age
- Must be a citizen, high school student, or business owner in Prairie Village or Mission Hills

# MAYOR'S MESSAGE

With 2003 coming to a close, we are provided an opportunity to reflect on the year that has passed and look toward the future.

The past year in Prairie Village has been challenging, yet rewarding. Early in the year the City Council struggled with budget shortfalls resulting from severe cuts in State funding. By focusing on essential services and careful financial management, Prairie Village has weathered the budget storm and adopted a 2004 City budget that continues to provide police protection, infrastructure improvements, parks, and other services residents seek without increasing the property tax rate.

As with every year in Prairie Village, the Summer months brought road construction. In 2003 the most significant infrastructure project in the City was the replacement of the Mission Road bridge between Tomahawk and 71st Street. Although traffic was detoured for several months, the new bridge opened in September, providing a new driving surface and improved traffic flow through the area.

In October, Prairie Village Police arrested a suspect in the 1974 murder of Lizabeth Wilson. This case, which was re-opened two years ago, was finally closed after 29 years. Congratulations go to all members, past and present, of the Prairie Village Police Department for their persistence in this case.

As we look toward the future, I'm confident that Prairie Village will be confronted with challenges and presented with opportunities. I also know that, through the concerted efforts of citizens, the Governing Body, and the City's dedicated employees, our community will remain a great place to live, work and play.

## Recycling in the Parks-Replacing Wood with Rubber


If you have visited Windsor Park recently, you may have noticed some changes around the swings and play equipment. The wood chip fall protection under one swing set has been replaced with rubber matting. The matting is similar to that used at Porter Park for the last few years.

The new material is manufactured from discarded rubber products like tires and sneakers. In the past, this product left black marks on clothing

and hands. Today, a new and improved product is available. It comes in various colors and also has an interlocking feature that helps keep the material in place, particularly under the slides, which have been a major maintenance problem for Public Works crews.

Each product is approved by the National Product Safety Council as a fall zone protection material. The Parks & Recreation Committee will be

considering placing these materials in other parks.



## 2004 Animal Licensing Begins Soon

2004 animal registration forms will be mailed shortly. City ordinance requires the annual licensing of all cats and dogs residing in the City. The ordinance also requires proof of a current rabies vaccination for licensing.

NOTE: The vaccination does not have to be valid throughout the calendar year, but must be valid at the time of licensing. THEREFORE, ALL PETS SHOULD BE ABLE TO BE LICENSED IN

JANUARY AND FEBRUARY. The license fee for a spayed or neutered pet is \$6. The fee for an animal that has not been spayed or neutered is \$12.

If a product is flammable, toxic, reactive, corrosive or explosive, it is HHW and requires special handling. How can you tell? Usually, you

will find the words "Warning," "Caution," "Danger," or "Poison" on the label. You can find a complete list of HHW materials on the Johnson County



## **Ball Field Reservation Applications Due**

Baseball Spring training will be here before you know it, and ballfields in Prairie Village are always in demand. Make plans **NOW** to reserve a field for your team

The City of Prairie Village allows reservations of ballfields for soccer, baseball, and softball practices. Prairie Village teams (those with a majority of players who are Prairie Village residents or attend school in Prairie Village) will be given priority for field reservations, but any team may apply to reserve a field. Teams can reserve two practice times per week for up to 1-1/2 hours. Fields are available in Porter, Franklin, Windsor, and Meadowlake Parks.

If your team reserved a field during 2003, your coach should receive a 2004 application form soon. Or you may obtain one at the Municipal Offices, 7700 Mission Road. There is a \$50 reservation fee per team that is to be submitted with your application. The deadline for submitting applications is January 16, 2004.
